There have been many times when I've auditioned for something I thought I was so right for, but it didn't work out. As actors, we deal with rejection all the time, and it was important for me to figure out what I learned about myself in the process of preparing for these auditions. Often the prep

for a part I didn't get led me to sharpen my skills for something else—something that was ultimately the perfect fit for me. And because I had worked so hard on the previous auditions, I already had all of those tools at my fingertips and was totally prepared.

FEAR FACTOR

It sounds odd coming from an actor, but I've dealt with shyness my entire life. With acting, you're in character. Now I'm becoming a public speaker, and trying to motivate people with my own experience, so I can't go up there and pretend I'm somebody else.
